12	FROM JUST A HIGH LEVEL OF OUR PRELIMINARY FINDINGS WE
13	NOTED INCONSISTENCIES IN SERVICES OFFERED DUE TO A LACK OF
14	CLEAR STANDARDS
15	NO, GO AHEAD.
16	MS. RAFFERTY: AND WHAT WE MEAN IS THAT THE WAY
17	CONTRACTS WERE PUT TOGETHER
18	THE COURT: RIGHT.
19	MS. RAFFERTY: FOR THE SERVICE PROVIDERS, THERE'S NO
20	CONSISTENT DEFINITION OF WHAT IS STORAGE, WHAT IS A SHOWER,
21	WHAT IS A HOT MEAL.
22	SO, THERE'S NO DEFINITION. AND IT WINDS UP BEING THE
23	SERVICE PROVIDER DEFINING THOSE FOR THE PEOPLE THAT THEY'RE

7	EFFECTIVENESS SO, LEADING TO UNEQUAL EXPERIENCES OR
8	PERCEPTIONS OF INEQUITY. BUT IT'S THE REALLY THE PARTICIPANTS
9	WHO SUFFER.
10	AND SO, FOR EXAMPLE, WE'RE HAPPY TO GO INTO EXACTLY

1	EXPECTED THAT YOU'LL ACCOMPANY PARTICIPANTS TO THEIR

2	AND I GUESS I'M CURIOUS, AND MAYBE YOU ALL KNOW OR
3	SOMEONE IN YOUR ZOOM KNOW.
4	HAVE YOU ALL EVER LOOKED AT A SCHEME LIKE THE ONE
5	ANALOGOUS TO THE ONE WE HAVE.
6	SO, FOR EXAMPLE, THE CONTRACT THAT YOUR FIRM HAS IS
7	WITH THE CITY OF L.A.
8	MS. RAFFERTY: CORRECT.
9	MR. MARQUEECE HARRIS-DAWSON: SO, IT'S DIRECT. THE
10	RELATIONSHIP IS A ONE TO ONE.
11	ALMOST NONE OF THE CONTRACTS WE HAVE WITH REGARD TO
12	SERVICES AT LEAST, WHICH YOU'VE SPENT WE TALKED A LOT ABOUT
13	THIS MORNING – ARE DIRECTLY WITH THE CONTRACTOR.
14	MS. RAFFERTY: CORRECT.
15	MR. MARQUEECE HARRIS-DAWSON: THEY'RE THROUGH LAHSA,
16	WHICH IS, YOU KNOW, A JOINT POWERS AUTHORITY.
17	SO, I'M WONDERING IF YOU'VE LOOKED AT ANYTHING LIKE THAT

1	HOW TO GET SERVICES FOR, EVEN THOUGH WE'VE ALLOCATED A LOT OF
2	MONEY TO LAHSA – OR I MEAN, IF YOU CALL LAHSA AT 5:01 IT'S CLOSED
3	FOR STARTERS.
4	BUT AND, AGAIN, I'M JUST BUT IT'S THE NATURE OF THE
5	SCHEME THAT WE THAT HAS BEEN THAT WE'VE ALL INHERITED.
6	I JUST WONDER IF YOU'VE LOOKED AT ANYTHING ELSE LIKE
7	THAT AROUND THE COUNTRY AND IF THERE ARE ANY LESSONS THAT YOU

3	DOES LAHSA PROVIDE YOU THAT THESE – WE KNOW EXACTLY WHERE
4	THOSE DOLLARS WENT. THEY WENT TO THE PERSON THAT THEY WERE

9	MEETINGS. AND I WELCOME EVERYONE TO BE PART OF THAT

9	LAHSA.
10	LAHSA EMPLOYEES ARE PAID MORE.
11	WE HAD A REALLY PHENOMENAL LISTENING SESSION THAT
12	SPECIAL MASTER MARTINEZ PUT TOGETHER WITH SOME SERVICE
13	PROVIDERS.
14	AND I THINK WHAT EVERYONE REMARKED UPON AND I THINK
15	YOU REMARKED UPON IT, TOO, JUDGE CARTER, IS THAT THE SERVICE
16	PROVIDERS HAVE VERY HARD JOBS AND ARE DOING
17	THE COURT: YEAH.
18	MS. MYERS: VERY HARD WORK. AND ONE OF THE
19	CHALLENGES IS RETENTION OF EMPLOYEES.
20	WE ARE LOOKING AT LINE BY LINE THE COST OF EMPLOYING
21	INDIVIDUALS WITHIN THE CITY OF LOS ANGELES TO DO THIS WORK.
22	WE ARE POINTING OUT THE COST OF THEIR HEALTH
23	INSURANCE, THE COST OF THE CELL PHONES THAT THEY USE.
24	EACH LINE BY LINE IS BEING PRESENTED AS A COST WITHOUT
25	AN ACKNOWLEDGEMENT THAT THIS IS THE COST OF A CASE WORKER,

1	RIGHT. WHAT IT COST A CASE MANAGER TO DO THIS WORK.
2	SAME THING WITH HOUSING NAVIGATION.
3	WE'RE SAYING PEOPLE AREN'T GETTING CONNECTED. BUT
4	THAT'S THE COST OF A HOUSING NAVIGATOR. AND IF YOU CAN'T FILL
5	THOSE POSITIONS BECAUSE THEY'RE UNDERPAID COMPARED TO LAHSA,
6	PEOPLE AREN'T GOING TO GET HOUSING NAVIGATION SERVICES.
7	I SAY THIS WITH REGARD TO THE CONTROLLER'S OFFICE
8	BECAUSE THIS IS A PHENOMENAL WEBSITE. BUT WE DON'T SEE WE
9	DON'T SEE IT AS INDIVIDUAL CASE MANAGERS. HOW MANY PEOPLE ARE
10	BEING FUNDED FOR THIS, RIGHT. WHAT EACH OF THE LINE ITEMS ARE.
11	WHAT IS THE COST OF EACH OF THESE PEOPLE. WHAT IS THE SALARY
12	THAT A PERSON IS RECEIVING BECAUSE I THINK IT'S JUST VERY EASY TO

21	SO, I DON'T KNOW IF THE CONTROLLER'S OFFICE CAN CAN
22	POINT OUT THE NUMBER OF EMPLOYEES WHO ARE PAID WITH THAT.
23	THAT I THINK WOULD BE USEFUL TO SAY IT COSTS \$52,000 FOR
24	A CASE WORKER TO PROVIDE THEM THE INCIDENTAL BENEFITS FICA.
25	YOU KNOW, THOSE KINDS OF THINGS.

1	THE COURT: ALL RIGHT.
2	MS. MYERS; AND THEN THEN WE CAN JUDGE IS IT TOO
3	EXPENSIVE TO PAY \$26,000 FOR AN OUTREACH WORKER, RIGHT. IS THAT
4	TOO EXPENSIVE.
5	THANK YOU.
6	MR. MEJIA: YEAH. AND I CAN JUST RESPOND, SHAYLA.
7	SO, WHEN YOU CLICK ON THE INVOICE AND IF YOU GO TO THE
8	INVOICE AND YOU SCROLL DOWN, YOU CAN ACTUALLY FIND THE
9	BREAK-DOWN ON HOW MUCH HOW MANY CASE MANAGERS WERE
10	THERE.
11	SO, THIS IS FOR THE MONTHS OF OCTOBER, NOVEMBER,

23	THE COURT: SO, THE VALUE JUDGMENTS LIE WITH YOU AS THE
24	ELECTED OFFICIALS NOT WITH THE COURT.
25	MY ONLY RED LINE IS I WANT THIS DATA UP. I WANT THE PUBLIC

1	TO BE ABLE TO SEE II. TWANT YOULTO BE ABLE TO SEE II. AND THEN
2	YOU MAKE YOUR DECISIONS AS ELECTED OFFICIALS.
3	AND THE ONE THING I'M ENCOURAGING THE CITY TO DO
4	WITHOUT TAKING ACTION TODAY IS TO MAKE CERTAIN OR HOPEFULLY
5	THINK ABOUT IF YOU'RE PAYING THE BILL, WHAT ARE YOU PAYING FOR.
